Head Teacher's Message

We end another successful year at Spring Common. It was so fantastic to see our young people arrive in style to their Post 16 prom and see our children transition to their new classes so quickly. Our Spring Comets (After School Club) staff have provided an amazing activities programme throughout the year. I take this opportunity to thank all staff for going the extra mile on so many

occasions to support our pupils by creating so many events and special enrichment activities to build our community.

Our new reception is almost completed and we expect this to be operational for September. You will be able to say hello to Kate, Eija and Jac on our return back. That will mean all pupils who arrive after 9.30 or leave before 3.15 will need to be signed in / out at the new reception.

The two mobiles coming on to the site will start in August to provide an extra classroom for lower school with soft play room and an additional classroom for upper school with a small sensory room. Cambridgeshire County Council is managing this project in discussion with the school. The contractors SDC will be onsite when we return to get the buildings completed as fast as possible.

As a consequence we will manage the interim with Linda's class moving temporarily into the Lower school physio room. Emily's class will stay in upper school and after half term will move to the new classroom in upper school.

Our Trustees are submitting a bid for the new 110 placement special school at Alconbury Weald by 2020 to enable the possibilities of the two special schools to work together in the future for the area. We know there will be competition from other Multi – Academy Trusts outside our area and hope our bid might be successful for the development of Spring Common and the local area. We hope parents and carers will support this project because the benefits would be significant for parents in the future as part of the wider vision for the Trust and provision of SEND.

Thank you to all parents and carers for your continued support; your feedback is always appreciated - so keep doing that.

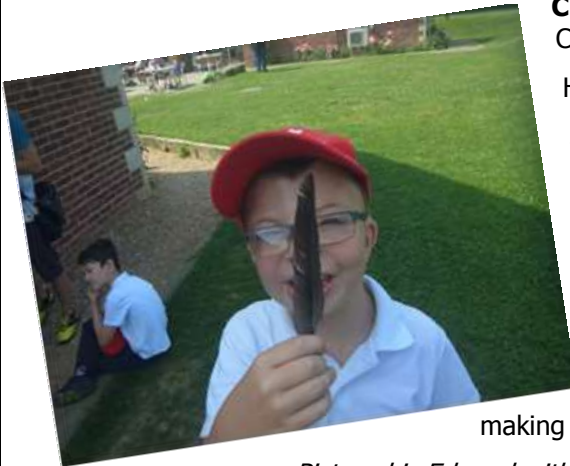
Class 4

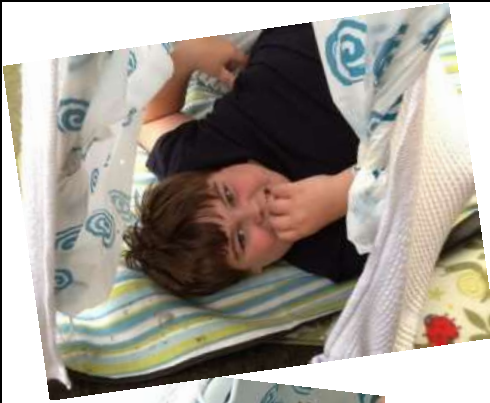


everyone. *Pictured is Edward with a feathery discovery.*

What a great final few weeks we have had in



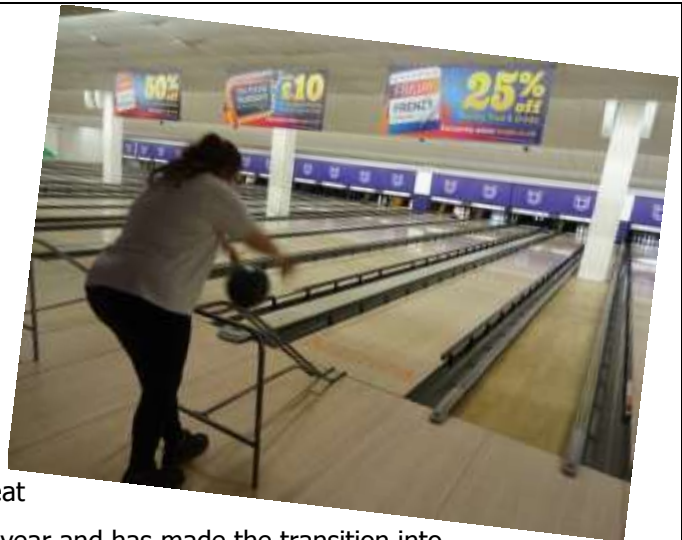
year 7, the highlight being our end of year trip bowling in Cambridge.

upper school seamlessly. Both class 7's have worked hard and made

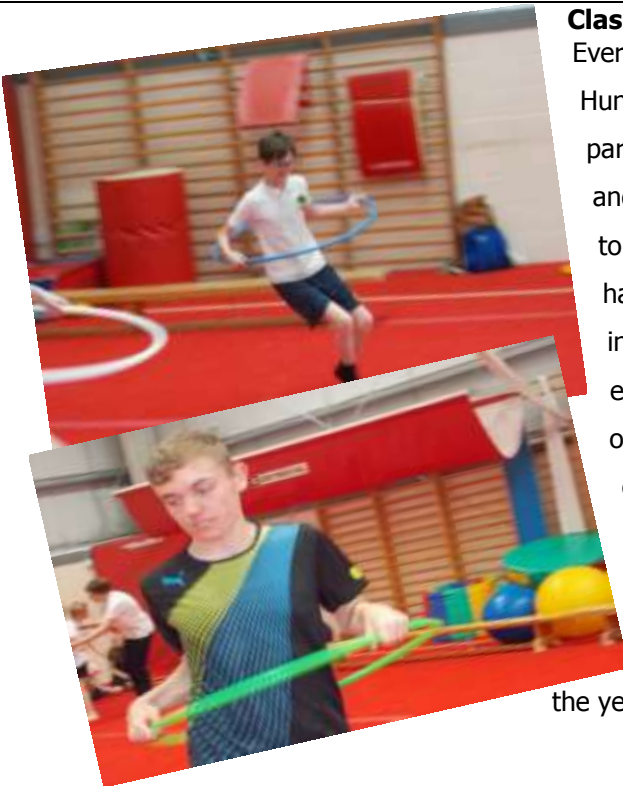
many great friendships over the past 12 months.

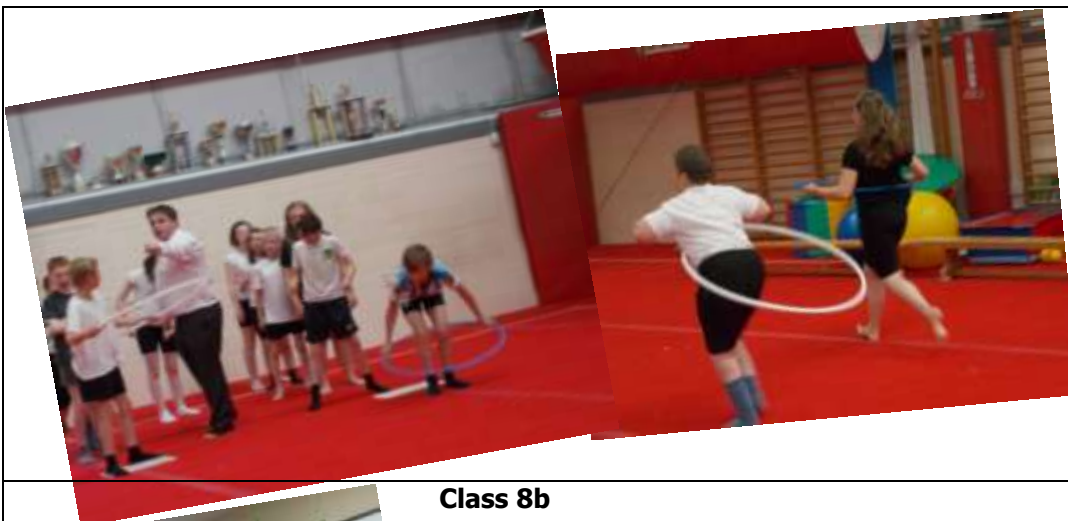

Class 8a

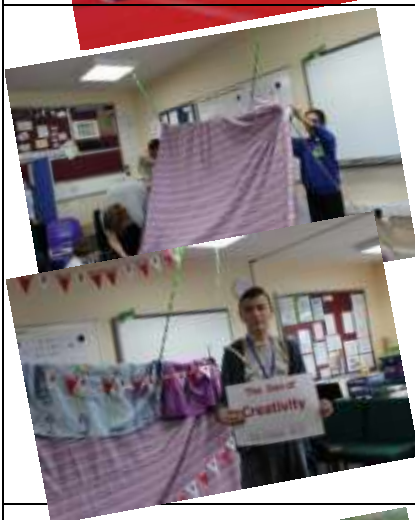

We have also been practicing our teamwork, learning about relay racing and communicating effectively.



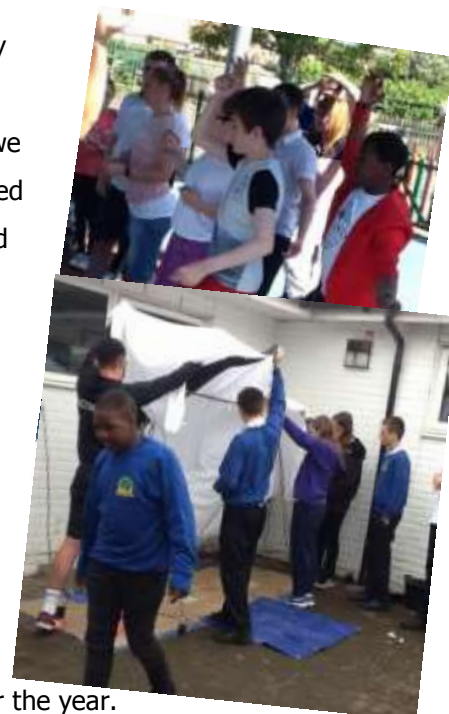
The class have really worked hard this year and have excelled and engaged in the curriculum, moving in to next year the class will continue to work around topics of growing up and independence in the household.

Class 11



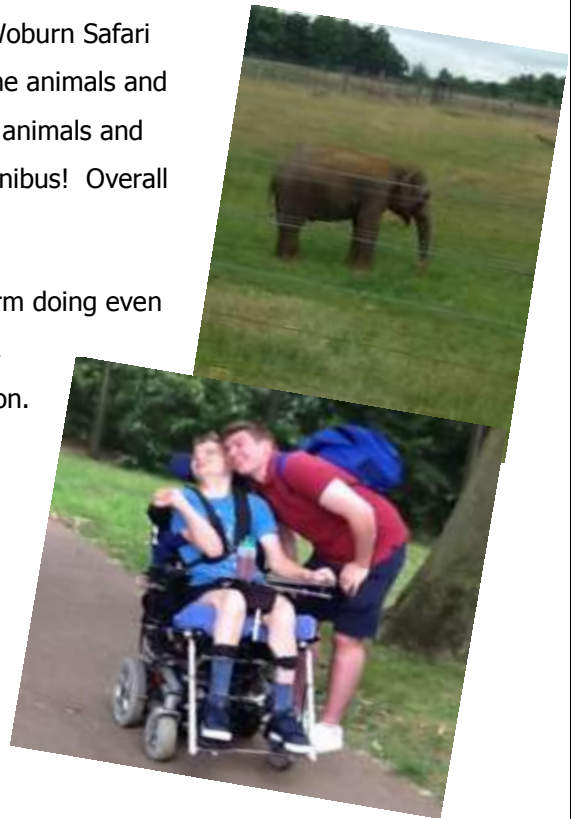

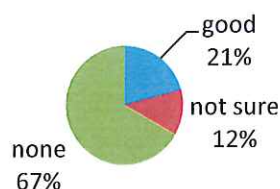


Schools Mental Health Awareness Workshops

At the beginning of the Spring Term Centre 33 visited the school to deliver a workshop to our year 10 and 11 students. The objective of the workshop was to raise awareness of good mental health in young people and inform them of how and where they could receive support if they had concerns around their own mental health.

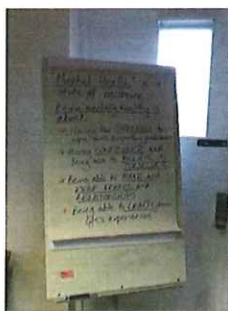
As part of the preparation for the visit we worked with the students and questioned them on mental health awareness. We asked them what good mental health might mean. The chart below shows the students understanding at this point.

Good mental health awareness before workshop and life skills lessons.



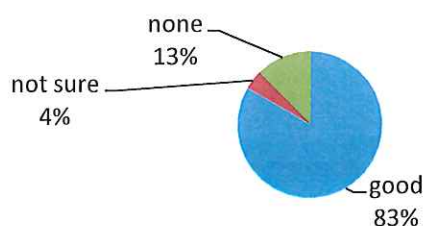
Ciara says 'The workshop helps me understand more about good mental

The workshop consisted of group discussions to develop the students understanding of what good mental health was. The students also completed practical activities to identify the differences between feeling happy and sad. The students developed a good understanding that it is ok to feel sad. In addition they were given information on how they could get support if they felt more than sad.



We continued working with the students to raise awareness of good mental health in their weekly life skills lessons throughout the rest of the year. The table below shows how the students feel now about understanding good mental health.
