



## **Individual Staff Risk Assessment Checklist for Covid-19**

Certain groups of people are at increased risk of becoming more unwell if they get infected with the new Corona virus (Covid-19). The following questions can help with identifying these staff who should be advised to follow the social distancing guidance found here. These staff can still work but should avoid contact with anyone with suspected or confirmed Covid-19 so should be deployed in non-frontline jobs where possible.

Note: Extremely Clinically Vulnerable

The most stringent precautions need to be followed for the most vulnerable people with complex health problems such as:

- people who have received an organ transplant and remain on ongoing immunosuppression medication
- people with cancer who are undergoing active chemotherapy or radiotherapy
- people with cancers of the blood or bone marrow such as leukaemia who are at any stage of treatment
- people with severe chest conditions such as cystic fibrosis or severe asthma (requiring hospital admissions or courses of steroid tablets)
- people with severe diseases of body systems, such as severe kidney disease (dialysis)

These staff should stay at home (and where possible carry out their work remotely)
