As we approach the end of the first half term of this academic year it is useful to reflect on the school's position.

This half term has felt difficult, with a broken hoist and high levels of staff absence. I value the staff's continued 'problem solving' approaches and working as a team of classes to ensure a positive curriculum is maintained. The classes feel settled and we are ready to explore how the key stages function. We want the key stage pupils to mix and learn together in different ways and times, more so from a social perspective. We will be having an Early Years & KS1 Christmas performance in December. More information will be sent home by the class teams shortly after we return from the half term break.


Please stay safe and I hope you all have a relaxing and warm half term break.
