



## **Pupil Premium Grant 2016-17**

The Pupil Premium Grant is a ring fenced grant from central government for all students aged 4 to 16 who are in receipt of free school meals or have been during the past 6 years, children of service personnel or children who have been adopted from care.

Funding is based on the January 2016 census figures.

Spring Common School bases its decisions on how the grant will be spent using the following considerations:

- meeting the individual needs of the pupils including the use of interventions where there is clear evidence of impact
- deployment of staff and development of skill set to meet specific needs
- analysis of information about attainment and identification of any deficits
- use of specialist equipment including IT to support learning
- monitoring of the impact of 2015-16 PPG spending
- views of parents, carers and other professionals involved with the pupil

For 2016-17 eligible pupils are those in the categories:

**FSM Ever 6** – any pupil who has been in receipt of free school meals in the last 6 years

Funding received = £1320 per primary age pupil, £935 per secondary age pupil

**Children of service personnel**

Funding received = £300 per pupil

3 pupils eligible

**Care premium for children who have been adopted**

Funding = £1900 per pupil
