# A message from Rebecca, Head Teacher

It has been a fantastic Spring term in school with lots of events and activities across the school. Highlights for me have been getting to know pupils, parents and carers and staff better and seeing the school at work. What a fantastic school!



### Safeguarding

As part of the continual drive to improve Safeguarding and keep our pupils safer, we have added a CEOPS button to the Online Safety section of the website. CEOPS (Child Exploitation and Online Protection command is a branch of the UK's National Crime Agency (NCA), and it works to safeguard children online). Pupils or parents can use this if they are worried about online sexual abuse or the way someone has been communicating online. There is also a link to make a report to one on CEOPS Child Protection Advisors.



### **Visitors from Belgium**

Once again, we hosted a group of sixth form students and their staff from St Joseph's. Students visited classes and found out about the work of a special school. They attended workshops on communication and gave us very positive feedback. It was lovely to see such a sense of pride in both pupils and staff showing what we do in school. Our pupils and students gained from having different social interactions and some students were able to find out more about what it is like going to sixth form in Belgium.



### **Red Nose Day**

Red Nose Day brought a huge amount of fun with it. Pupils enjoyed wearing non-uniform or something red and guessing the names of the soft toys and numbers of sweets in a jar. ### **Autism Awareness Day**

This year we marked Autism Awareness Day by a whole school art project, making precious colourful pots which were placed together outside in the shape of the infinity symbol. The Autism infinity symbol is often displayed in rainbow colours to show that we are all different, symbolising and celebrating the broad and varied spectrum of experience.

### **New Road Safety Signs**

We are continuously reviewing our processes, practice and environment to keep pupils as safe as possible and as part of this work, we have some new road safety signs in the car park and facing the road. They were given to the school by Road Safety Advisor Rosemary Mullen following her visit in February. They send a positive message to road users reminding them to slow their speed and allow pupils to cross the road safely.

### Parent / Carer Evening

This was once again a great success with many parents and carers coming into school in person and others engaging in meetings over Teams or phone calls. Thanks to everyone for supporting with this.

### Parent / Carer Survey

We had 76 responses to our parent/carer survey in February.

- 92% reported their child is safe.
- 91% noted they were happy at school .
- 76% rated communication from school as 'just right'.

- 74% of those who had raised a concern strongly agreed/agreed it had been fully dealt with.
- 95% of respondents said they accessed Earwig.
- 80% said they felt well-informed about their child's learning.

Suggestions for what Spring Common Academy could do better included;

- More parental involvement.
- Better communication.
- More speech and language.
- More staff.
- Workshops for parents and carers.

Examples parents / carers gave of staff going 'above and beyond' -

- "My child struggles with his eating and is supported by encouragement and awards to help him achieve his eating goals".
- "My child is very impulsive, and they go above and beyond to make sure he remains safe".
- "Lovely school, happy children, great teaching team".

A big thank you to all who responded, your feedback helps us in our continued development and improvement.

### Pupil Survey Spring 2024

Our pupils were supported to give their views of school.

74% of our pupils strongly agreed that they like being at school.(90% agreed or strongly agreed) "School makes me feel smart."

82% of our pupils strongly agreed that they have friends at school.(95% agreed or strongly agreed) "At school I like having friends."

88% of our pupils strongly agreed that the adults at school look after me.(95% agreed or strongly agreed)"You are nice to people."

83% of our pupils strongly agreed that they know how to ask for help at school.(97% agreed or strongly agreed)"You help me do my work."

82% of our pupils strongly agreed that they feel safe at school.(92% agreed or strongly agreed)"School makes people feel safe and we follow rules."

Suggestions for making school even better included having more things to do outside, having access to more technology, and more trips out of school... although one pupil said "you do not need to make it better."

### A message from Tom, Safeguarding Lead and Assistant Head KS4 & Post 16

We held a coffee morning this term at Spring Common Academy, followed by a talk on online safety.

As we are all keenly aware, Online Safety is imperative for our children and ourselves, and we are working with our students in line with the national curriculum to support them in developing the safest approach to online content.

Key talking points included:

- The most popular Apps, their purpose and their Age Ratings
- Privacy Settings
- Parental Controls
- Encouraging communication and monitoring

We discussed how students access the internet, and what they do during their screen time, whether it is engaging with social media, watching videos or playing games. We all agreed that there are positive benefits in accessing the internet. You can learn, communicate with your friends, and experience and see things that you otherwise might have the opportunity to.

The underbelly of the internet, however, is the risk students may expose themselves to when navigating online platforms. This could be witnessing inappropriate videos, chatting with strangers, consuming excessive amounts of content or being exposed to radical ideologies and communities online.

As adults, we have learned to navigate this space safely, and are now learning to impart this best practice to our children.







So much has been achieved by all students and staff in such a short Spring Term!

Notably, there has been another successful Crossing Borders Project with the visit by our friends from St Josef Seminaire school in Belgium. We are very much looking forward to visiting Belgium shortly after the Easter holidays with a group of P16 students.

I want to thank both Post 16 and Key Stage 4 classes for two very successful enterprise events this term, the Spring Fair and The Toy Fayre which brought an opportunity for our whole school community to come together for worthwhile causes. Finally, they had a lovely multisensory experience going to Peterborough by train which everyone enjoyed. Looking forward to the summer term Wild Weather Adventure.


